- 1. Welcoming and greeting the family upon arrival to make them feel at home in their new community.
- 2. Assisting with finding safe, affordable housing and ensuring that it is equipped with necessary household items to meet the family's basic needs.
- 3. Providing food and essential items to ensure that the family's basic needs are met while they adjust to their new life.
- 4. Helping the family navigate and access public benefits such as healthcare, education, and employment opportunities.
- 5. Connecting adults to English language classes and other education opportunities to help them become self-sufficient.
- 6. Assisting with enrolling children in school and helping them adjust to a new academic environment.
- 7. Providing cultural orientation and integration services to help the family understand and adapt to their new community and culture.
- 8. Offering transportation services to help the family get to appointments, run errands, and explore their new surroundings.
- 9. Providing ongoing support and problemsolving as the family adjusts to their new life and overcomes challenges along the way.
